A Word From the Publisher

he world of private trucking is often viewed as a business separate from the one in which for-hire freight carriers operate. Companies use their own trucks for various reasons – making deliveries to stores, for example, and providing a reliable source of freight-hauling capacity.

In most cases, the job performed by drivers extends beyond driving to include sales and inventory functions. One thing that private and for-hire carriers share, however, is the desire for efficiency.

This year's edition of TRANSPORT TOPICS Top 100 Private Carriers drives home that point by showcasing companies that are using their distribution expertise and marketing muscle to improve the efficiency of freight hauling for everyone.

Wal-Mart Stores Inc. is trying to play a leading role in facilitating change. The world's largest retailer wants to take more control of freight coming into its distribution centers from vendors. By doing so,

the company believes it can reduce costs by hauling more freight in fewer trailers and running fewer miles.

Owens & Minor Inc. is a company in the business of distributing medical and surgical products. Although not nearly as large — annual sales of \$8 billion for Owens & Minor compares with \$405 billion for Walmart — the Virginia-based company nonetheless saw an opportunity to help medical device manufacturers consolidate their outbound shipments and reduce the transportation costs by as much 20%.

A consolidation center for the new venture, called OM HealthCare Logistics, opened in Louisville, Ky., in May and a second center is planned for the West Coast in the next year.

Owens & Minor also uses its private fleet to distribute goods from each of 52 regional distribution centers around the country. Drivers are considered front-line associates who interact daily with customers, delivering custom orders on a just-in-time basis to doctors and nurses in hospitals and clinics.

If that sounds a lot like the way for-hire freight carriers supply parts to manufacturing plants, you're right to make the comparison.

As Senior Features Writer Daniel P. Bearth reports, the combination of savings from consolidation and inventory reduction is giving companies and their private fleets a new sense of mission and importance.

Food and beverage companies are moving quickly to take advantage of their large and far-flung distribution systems.

Both PepsiCo and the Coca-Cola Co. have moved to take over independent bottlers and will use their large combined fleets to haul more products more efficiently.

[•] Food-service delivery specialist McLane Co. operates a third-party logistics provider and manages all inbound shipments into its grocery and food-service distribution cen-

ters. The company also devised a new distribution network to deliver fresh produce and baked goods to convenience store outlets.

Mohawk Industries, a carpet manufacturer, runs a fleet of specialized delivery trucks; Stan Brooks, its director of transportation, also overseas a complex network of inbound and outbound loads. His objective: fill empty trailers and reduce the number of miles needed to complete each delivery.

Everyone in trucking should pay attention to these initiatives because a more efficient freight delivery system is something that should have benefits for all of us.
