A Word From the Publisher

ne of the things that most of us in the United States and Canada take for granted is the ability to obtain food and beverages pretty much whenever and wherever we want.

We don't often think about where food comes from or how it got there.

In fact, a mighty army of trucks and shipper-owned fleet operators are largely responsible for delivering virtually everything we consume, and on a daily basis.

For this 2008 edition of the Transport Topics Top 100 Private Carriers list, Senior Features Writer Daniel P. Bearth describes how this past year's dramatic rise in fuel costs has

affected the way these companies deliver products from farms and processing plants to supermarkets, bars and restaurants, vending machines and countless other locations.

As one analyst put it, "We have to think differently." Peter Stiles, a supply chain consultant and vice president of LeanLogistics Inc., said the expectation that fresh produce can be shipped from the far ends of the world regardless of the growing season may soon have to change because of rising fuel costs. Instead, expect to see more fresh produce canned or frozen near where it is grown to take advantage of lower-cost shipping methods, he said.

Some other changes include:

■ Coca-Cola Enterprises, the largest independent bottler for Coca-Cola Co. and ranked No. 1 for the first time on this year's Top 100 list, is ramping up its purchases of fuel-saving diesel-electric hybrid delivery trucks.

■ Wal-Mart Stores, the world's largest retailer and No. 3 on the Top 100 list, is working with suppliers to reduce the amount of packaging used for everything from milk to detergent, enabling the company to save fuel by carrying more goods in the same amount of space in its trailers and, in turn, reducing the number and frequency of store deliveries.

■ Kraft Foods is using more underground storage and testing "all sorts of technologies" to improve fuel mileage in its truck fleet. The company replaced about 100 trucks with cleanerburning 2008-model tractors equipped with auxiliary power units to curb fuel consumption while trucks are being loaded and unloaded.

Almost half of the companies on the Transport Topics Top 100 Private Carriers list are involved in the distribution of agricultural products and food and beverages. For companies such as

Pilgrim's Pride Corp. and Tyson Foods, the high cost of fuel has been a double whammy, increased the cost of corn and soybeans used to feed livestock in addition to raising the cost of food distribution.

On the other hand, Archer Daniels Midland, a major grain producer that maintains an extensive fleet of trucks, trains and barges to distribute grain products, sees an opportunity to capitalize on demand for alternative fuel. Already the nation's largest producer of ethanol, ADM is actively pursuing projects to convert vegetable oil into biodiesel and other substitutes for petroleum-based lubricants and greases.

Some products are already on the market. TODCO, a manufacturer of overhead truck doors, for example, has introduced a food-grade lubricant that company officials say works equally well and costs about the same as the TODCO Lube product currently made from petroleum distillates.

We may not know exactly how higher fuel costs will ultimately affect food distribution, but in looking at the issue through the lens of the Top 100 Private Carriers, we are hopeful that you can at least see the direction that those changes are taking.

And we trust that our ongoing coverage will help readers understand and prepare for these changes.
