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A Word From the Publisher

"It's not the strongest of the species that survives . . . nor the most intelligent . . . but the one that's most responsive to change." — Charles Darwin

Dave Barnes, senior vice president and chief information officer for UPS Inc., used this quotation to help explain the evolution of the world's largest package carrier into a high-tech, multimodal, global transportation services provider.

It also puts into context many of the changes that have occurred since TRANSPORT TOPICS published the first Top 100 list of the largest U.S. and Canadian for-hire carriers in 1989.

Although UPS remains by far the biggest freight transportation company on the TT 100 For-Hire Carriers, it is clearly not the same company it was in 1989.

UPS Chairman Michael Eskew, who along with Barnes spoke to media representatives at the UPS Technology Summit in Louisville, Ky., in September, said UPS in the 1970s and 1980s was a "one-way business."

"We had one product, and we did it our way," he said.

Now, the company that prided itself on being the "tightest ship in the shipping business" wants to be known for providing virtually any kind of transportation service anywhere in the world and treating each shipment as if it were "the only one."

To do that, UPS turned itself inside out, converting from private to public ownership in 1999, acquiring more than two dozen companies and investing approximately \$1 billion annually on new and improved technology to provide, as Eskew said, "not just products, but solutions."

The TT 100 For-Hire Carriers, to provide an annual snapshot of the industry's leading companies, has documented many such corporate transitions.

Former Ryder System executive Bill Zollars brought

together two of the nation's largest longhaul, less-than-truckload carriers — Yellow Freight System and Roadway Express — and added regional LTL carrier and logistics group USF Corp. to create YRC Worldwide.

Other companies diversified by adding intermodal and dedicated contract carriage services to traditional over-the-road trucking. Air freight specialists and freight forwarders set up ground distribution networks to offer integrated freight services.

Helping readers to see and understand these changes is the reason the TT 100 For-Hire Carriers has become the most anticipated feature of the year for readers of TRANSPORT TOPICS.

Our goal has been to provide more than a simple ranking of company names and numbers. That's why the TT 100 For-Hire Carriers includes names of top executives, ownership, a description of services and data on the number of company and owner-operator tractors and trailers.

Each company listed on the TT 100 has a story to tell, and as a group they tell a bigger story of a trucking industry driven by the force of competition to change and adapt to new market conditions.

Just as companies have evolved, so has the TT 100. In 2002, we published the first Top 100 list of private carriers, a ranking based on the number of Class 8 tractors in shipper-owned fleets. Later that year, we launched the TRANSPORT TOPICS Logistics 50, a listing of the largest logistics companies in North America.

Earlier this year, TRANSPORT TOPICS' affiliate, LIGHT & MEDIUM TRUCK magazine, published the Top 50 Commercial Truck Fleets and Top 50 Utility and Telecom Fleets.

Each of these lists provides a valuable record of an industry in transition. The companies and the people who run them are literally writing tomorrow's history.

We are hopeful that this year's edition of the TT 100 For-Hire Carriers provides our readers with a glimpse of what that future will be.

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The biggest for-hire carriers continue to get bigger as higher rates and fuel surcharges boost revenue and companies make strategic acquisitions. Capacity remained tight, however, as carriers put the brakes on adding company-owned tractors, but expanded their use of rail transportation and owner-operators.

Revenue growth varied widely among for-hire carriers. In 2005, contract/logistics firms posted a 27.1% gain, and vehicle haulers registered a 5.5% change, compared with 2004. In the truckload sector, Swift Transportation and Schneider National trade top places.



100 Largest Carriers Get Bigger as Demand, Consolidation Rise

The biggest for-hire carriers are getting a lot bigger as industry consolidation and robust demand for freight hauling bolstered revenue for nearly all of the companies on the 2006 TRANSPORT TOPICS 100 list of the largest for-hire carriers in the United States and Canada.

Combined revenue of the Top 100 for-hire carriers was \$175.7 billion in 2005, an increase of 12.4% from \$156.3 billion in 2004. All but three carriers posted increases in revenue. Total employment rose 3.9% to 1.2 million.

In terms of equipment, there was little change in the number of company-owned tractors, an indication that executives were cautious about expanding their fleets because of the increasing difficulty in hiring qualified truck drivers and, perhaps, a desire to avoid an oversupply that would undermine rates and hurt future profits.

For-hire carriers operated a total of 355,912 tractors in 2005, an increase of less than 1% from 353,360 tractors in 2004.

However, the number of tractors supplied by owner-operators rose 3.2% to 62,771 units in 2005 from 60,815 units in 2004, a change that reflects, in part, a move by some carriers to lease equipment to former company drivers.

The number of trailers increased 2.3% to 730,125 units, while the number of intermodal freight containers jumped 8.5% to 56,878 units. Swift Transportation and NFI Industries added containers to their equipment pool for the first time in 2005.

Topping the TRANSPORT TOPICS 100 list, as they have since TT first appeared in its current format in 1998, are parcel carriers UPS Inc. and FedEx Corp.

Each of the parcel carriers has made dramatic moves in the past year to expand already sizeable portfolios of transportation services by buying large less-than-truckload carriers.

UPS acquired Overnite Corp. last August and now runs the business as UPS Freight, which ranks No. 4 this year on the list of the largest LTL carriers. FedEx is in the process of acquiring Lakeland, Fla.-based LTL longhaul specialist Watkins Motor Lines. Watkins ranks No. 7 on the list of largest LTL carriers.

Exel Americas, a huge trucking and logistics entity that ranked No. 8 on the TRANSPORT TOPICS 100 a year ago, is now part of DHL Americas. This acquisition followed the purchase in December of Exel's London-based parent by Deutsche Post World Net, the parent of Amsterdam-based DHL.

None of Exel America's revenue was included in the revenue for DHL Americas in 2005. The addition of Exel is likely to narrow the gap between DHL and its primary competitors, UPS and FedEx, in 2006.

Other significant moves by companies on the TRANSPORT TOPICS 100 list include the rebranding of CNF Inc. as Con-way Inc. and the formation of Greatwide Logistics Services, a holding company for companies with business that includes contract carriage, freight brokerage and warehousing.

Two companies were added to the TRANSPORT TOPICS 100 this year, based on revenue estimates provided by Satish Jindel, an industry consultant who works closely with parcel and LTL carriers. R&L Carriers in Wilmington, Ohio, and CenTra Inc. of Warren, Mich., each with sizeable and growing LTL operations, are ranked No. 31 and No. 54, respectively. Information on all other carriers came from public company annual reports or directly from management.

Three other carriers are listed this year for the first time. They are: Bennett International Group (No. 81) in McDonough, Ga., a company that hauls new vehicles, mobile homes and trailers; TransAm Trucking (No. 92) in Olathe, Kan., a refrigerated truckload carrier; and Maverick USA (No. 100) in Little Rock, Ark., a holding company for steel hauler Maverick Transportation.

Several carriers also dropped off the TRANSPORT TOPICS 100. Besides Overnite, G.I. Trucking (No. 86 in 2005), a California-based regional LTL carrier, was acquired by Estes Express Lines. Estes previously held an equity interest in G.I. Trucking.

LTL carrier A. Duie Pyle Cos. (No. 99 in 2005) and refrigerated truckload carrier Navajo Shippers (No. 100 in 2005) just missed the cut this year. The revenue threshold was just shy of \$200 million in 2005 but up from \$168 million in 2004.

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



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
